

The Kenny Schall Scholarship



Giving students opportunities to exceed

Dear Scholarship Candidate,

The Schall family is pleased to announce its scholarship program in honor of their son Kenny Schall, a Centennial graduate. Kenny gave his life for those things he loved most when he was killed in Iraq on May 22, 2005. This scholarship will be awarded to multiple students, and may be used at any four-year university, community college or vocational/technical school. The Kenny Schall Scholarship Committee is accepting applications from students who:

- Are graduating Centennial High School seniors entering a four-year university, community college or vocational/technical school.
- Have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Value patriotism and what it stands for.

The Rules and Requirements for the scholarship are as follows:

1. An essay or video must be submitted with your application on the topic below.
 - a. Essays must have a word count between 1,000 and 1,500 words.
 - b. Videos must be between 2-3 minutes in length.
2. The essay/video must be in English.
3. The essay/video must not be a poem.
4. All work submitted must be original, authored/recorded solely by the applicant.
5. Each essay/video will be judged based on the following key elements: treatment of the assigned writing prompt and plan of organization, mechanics, grammar, and clear and effective language. Entries will be judged anonymously and will not be returned.
6. All entries (essay and application) must be received by Mr. Mark Schmidt (Room 224), no later than Monday, March 26, 2018. Entries received after 2:30 p.m. on March 26, 2018 will not be accepted or reviewed under any circumstances.
 - a. Videos must be emailed to tschall@centurylink.net (application must be delivered separately to Room 224).
7. Selected candidates will be interviewed and selected by the Kenny Schall Scholarship Committee.
8. Scholarships will be paid to the student's college; four-year University, community college or vocational/technical school of their choice in late July, and after verification of students' acceptance at identified college/school.
